



## Workplace fatalities by event or exposure, Washington, 2008, all ownerships (83 Total fatalities)





## Fatal work injuries by location, Washington, 2008, all ownerships (83 Total fatalities)





### Occupations with the largest number of worker fatalities, 2008, Washington, all ownerships (83 Total fatalities)




