What should I do after taking the quiz?

Eligible Ability to Work Assessment (AWA) Quiz for 1 CEU

Dan was referred to you for Vocational Rehabilitation Assessment. Dan worked as a construction laborer. He successfully completed a year of college and he has a forklift operator's license.

In 2010, Dan was injured at work and sought medical attention from Dr. Adams, the attending physician. At the time of injury he was lifting up to 80 pounds in the course of his daily job tasks.

Dr. Adams determined the workplace injury to be a lumbosacral sprain which was surgically repaired. While the surgery was successful, it was unknown whether Dan would regain his pre-injury level of physical function.

Dan's employer offered him two transitional work opportunities during recovery. One as a forklift operator, which would require him to lift 50 pounds, and one as a delivery driver, which would require him to lift 40 pounds. Dr. Adams disapproved both of the job analysis (JA).

Dr. Adams completed an Activity Prescription Form (APF) indicating Dan was able to lift 20 pounds. Dr. Simmons provided an independent medical examination (IME) indicating Dan was capable of lifting up to 30 pounds.

The injury occurred during an economic downturn in the construction industry. Dan's employer was not able to offer him a medically-approved return-to-work position.

After his workplace injury Dan also injured his right arm in a motor vehicle accident. He was charged with a DUI and lost his driver's license.

Dan has a preexisting condition of Essential Hypertension. A contended depressive disorder was denied.

As part of his treatment plan for the workplace injury, Dan was referred to physical therapy. He missed 1 of 3 appointments. You are recommending that Dan is eligible for Plan Development **(SAS3)**.
