DOSH Rules Update	<p>Chris Miller, mics235@Lni.wa.gov DOSH Standards Program Manager, provided updates on the DOSH Rulemaking Summary handout.</p> <p>Penalty Rule: Public hearings, which started March 10th, have been completed; rule effective 9/1/15. DOSH staff will receive training on the new penalty rule prior to 9/1/15.</p> <p>Temporary Worker Housing rule is scheduled to be filed 6/16/15; rule effective 8/1/15; public hearings were held jointly with Department of Health.</p> <p>Global Harmonization for Agriculture rule scheduled to be filed 6/16/15, with an effective date of 8/3/15.</p> <p>A rule petition for Lockout/Tagout for Sawmills was received requesting the department to add a reference to Chapter 296-803 Lockout/Tagout and also compare 296-803 with 296-878.</p>	<p>RECOMMENDATION/ACTION: Alan Lundeen will follow-up with Lee Newgent regarding confined spaces and get contact information for those interested in stakeholder meetings.</p> <p>Alan Lundeen will ask Pam Cant to contact Tammie Hetrick regarding hazardous drugs stakeholder meetings.</p>

	<p>Recordkeeping and Reporting rule is complete with an effective date of 7/1/15.</p> <p>Work continues on the Telecommunications rule; stakeholder meetings are planned.</p> <p>Work is continuing on the rulemaking necessary to revise 296-45 WAC (Electrical Workers) to comply with changes in OSHA 29CFR Parts 1910 Electric Power Generation, Transmission and Distribution and 1926 Subpart V Power Transmission and Distribution; stakeholder meetings continue.</p> <p>High voltage/helicopters: This rulemaking will be on the same schedule as the electrical workers rulemaking project.</p> <p>Confined Space: New from OSHA; under review.</p> <p>eRules Project: Still in progress; a bit behind schedule because of staff resources.</p> <p>Anne Soiza and Alan Lundeen answered questions and provided background information on some of the rules to the Committee members. <p>SHARP Updates</p>	<p>Dave Bonauto, bone235@lni.wa.gov thanked the Committee for their letter of support for continued grant funding; he received confirmation that funding will continue.</p> <p>Dave provided a summary of the information about the handouts provided at today’s meeting.</p> <p>A magazine article titled, “A System’s Approach to Safer Caregiving”.</p> <p>A handout for a Fatality Narrative was provided describing the circumstances of the fatality of a laborer that was electrocuted when the jackhammer he was using struck an underground power line.</p> <p>A Logging Injury Alert handout described the incident that led to the death of a choker setter when he was struck by a log.</p> <p>Two fatality investigative reports were provided as handouts titled, “Log Truck Driver Dies When Struck by Logs Being Loaded Onto Trailer” and “Two Propane Gas Supplier Workers Electrocuted When Boom Truck Crane’s Boom Contacts 7,200 Volt Overhead Power Line”.</p> <p>An Injury Narrative telling how a construction worker suffered a severe traumatic brain injury when he fell approximately 14 feet and hit his head on the concrete below.</p> <p>Other handouts included posters and information for the trucking industry. BIIA Updates	<p>David Threedy provided updates about the status of BIIA actions relating to WISHA appeals. He also described three cases of interest that involved employee misconduct.</p> <p>David answered questions from the audience about employee misconduct, the mediation process and the status on the Tesoro hearings.</p>	
DOSH Education and Outreach Updates	<p>Bruce Zeller, ZELL235@Lni.wa.gov, provided an update on the WISHA 10 for Agriculture Pilot. The WISHA 10 for Agriculture Pilot Program's primary objective is the training of trainers within the agriculture industry. The program provides training in both English and Spanish for agricultural workers on the recognition, avoidance, abatement, and prevention of safety and health hazards in the agricultural workplaces. The pilot has been very successful and will continue with an emphasis on training trainers so they can provide this training to others.</p> <p>APP: Using the most cited violations by DOSH inspectors, Education and Outreach looked at ways to help employers. Some ideas being worked on are: continue to add online training modules, step-by-step guidelines to complete an APP, short online videos, and add more industry-specific webpages. A short video using animation has been developed and was previewed.</p>	
DOSH Updates	<p>Anne Soiza provided a PowerPoint presentation, Focus on Facts. The presentation describes what's been learned from fatality and worker compensation data, latest news and data, learnings from fatality and hospitalization data and prevention focus.</p>
