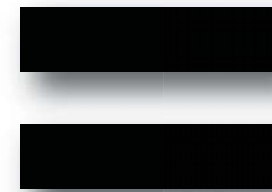
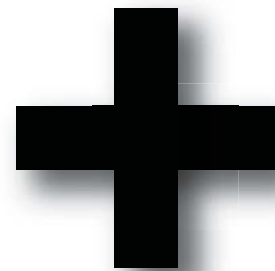


# Don't Fall for It

Not paying attention to the details will make even a simple job hazardous.  
Falls from same level account for 8% of all trucking injuries.



## Prevent falls while securing a load

- Inspect and replace worn straps and chains
- Inspect and replace bent cargo bars, worn pad ends or damaged locking mechanisms
- Upgrade to ratchet winch tie downs to reduce the hazards from using a winch bar
- Maintain solid footing and a stable body position
