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

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Apprenticeship by the Numbers

There were **12,599** active apprentices for the 12-month time period ending March 31, 2015 of which **1,284** were women and **3,050** were minority. Over the last quarter (January - March 2015) there were **10,314** active apprentices. For a complete listing of new registrations by occupation, please contact staff in the Tumwater office. The department tracks the number of active apprentices over time and recent expansion trends appear to be continuing with a robust start to the number of apprentice registrations this quarter. The recent registration activity is being led by building and construction trade occupations.



Apprentice Activity (January – March 2015):


- **10,314** active apprentices during the time period
- **161** individuals were issued completion certificates
- **328** individuals were cancelled
- **1,022** individuals were registered as apprentices (**872** registrations previous quarter)

Minority, Female and Veteran Participation (January – March 2015):


- **2,501** active minority apprentices (24%)
- **979** active female apprentices (9%)
- **1,047** active veteran apprentices (10%)

The building and construction trade occupations continue to drive numbers in terms of total completions or journeylevel credentials issued. 
Registrations by Occupation >10
