## Introduction

CHAIRMAN OLSON: Good morning, everybody. I'd like to call the public hearing to order. This is the Board of Boiler Rules public hearing, May 28, 2014. I'm Rob Olson. I'm chairman of the Board. I'm representing manufacturers, and I will serve as the hearing officer.

For the record, this meeting is being held on May 28, 2014 in Tacoma, Washington, and we are beginning at 10:04 pursuant to the authority given under the Open Public Meetings Act and the Administrative Procedures Act.

At this time I'd like the Board members to introduce themselves by stating your name and affiliation. We'll begin to my left and then we'll come on over to this side.

BOARD MEMBER WAYTASHEK: My name is Jeff Waytashek. I'm the representative for owners/users.

BOARD MEMBER TREND: Larry Trenda, Board member representing professional engineers.

BOARD MEMBER CHAPIN: Terry Chapin, Board member representing boiler operators and boilermakers.

MS. SHOBLUM: Calista Shoblom, State of Washington.

BOARD MEMBER ODA: Tony Oda, chief boiler inspector, secretary to the Board.

1 MR. CARLSON: Mark Carlson, State of Washington.

2 MR. LEET: Larry Leet, City of Seattle.

3 MR. BARNES: Jeff Barnes, Hartford Steam Boiler.

4 MR. McINTOSH: Brian McIntosh, Hartford Steam Boiler.

5 CHAIRMAN OLSON: Okay. Very good, everybody.

6 Welcome.

7 If you have not done so, we have a sign-up sheet, if  
8 you would like to offer testimony, for the issues that are  
9 coming before us during this public hearing. When we get  
10 to that point, I will call on you and ask if you'd like to  
11 offer any testimony. I have one. Do we have any others  
12 that would like to speak on behalf of the items? Very  
13 good.

14 If any of you would like to offer written comments,  
15 please give them to myself to be recorded. We will accept  
16 written comments until 5 p.m. today, May 28, 2014.

4 Overview/Summary

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6 CHAIRMAN OLSON: Summary of the proposed rules: This  
7 hearing is held to consider oral and written testimony  
8 presented on the proposed rules. Those four proposed rule  
9 changes are shown in our meeting packet. Any comments  
10 received today as well as written comments received will  
11 be presented to the Director of the Department of Labor  
12 and Industries. The tentative adoption date for these  
13 rules is June 17, 2014, and the tentative effective date  
14 is August 1, 2014.
