



PREPROPOSAL STATEMENT OF INQUIRY

CR-101 (June 2004)
(Implements RCW 34.05.310)
Do NOT use for expedited rule making

Agency: Department of Labor and Industries

Subject of possible rule making: Chapter 296-19A WAC Vocational Rehabilitation, Chapter 296-14 WAC Industrial Insurance, and Chapter 296-15 WAC Workers' compensation self-insurance rules and regulations.

Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject: RCW 51.04.020, 51.04.030, 51.32.095, and Chapter 72, Laws of 2007 (ESSB 5920).

Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish: The proposed rules will assist in the implementation of Chapter 72, Laws of 2007 (ESSB 5920). To implement the pilot program for vocational rehabilitation services, this rulemaking will include new rules and may include amendments of existing rules.
