The department has conducted a review of various classifications and determined that certain classifications are in need of revision for purposes of clarification. Revisions are being considered for the following classifications:

- WAC 296-17A-6306 Stores: Furniture – Adding a sub-classification for businesses providing audio visual services
- WAC 296-17A-6601 Detective Agencies - Adding a sub-classification for businesses providing process services and legal messenger services
- WAC 296-17A-5301 Accounting or Bookkeeping Services – Correct reference to establishments engaged in providing process services and legal messenger services to classification 6601
- WAC 296-17A-6303 Outside sales personnel, NOC messengers – Add reference to establishments providing process and legal messenger services are to be reported in classification 6601
