Purpose: Chapter 33, Laws of 2010 (Substitute House Bill 2546) requires the program to conduct rulemaking regarding electrical trainees. SHB 2546 increases the classroom education hours required for an electrical trainee to renew their electrical training certificate. The department needs to adopt rules implementing SHB 2546 by July 1, 2011.

For training certificates, the rulemaking will:

- Effective July 1, 2011, increase the number of approved basic classroom electrical training hours from 16 to 32.
- Effective July 1, 2013, increase the number of approved basic classroom electrical training hours to 48.
- Require equivalent classes to be submitted and approved by the chief electrical inspector.
