Purpose:

This agency classifies businesses according to their nature. The former rules stated that employers could have more than one basic risk classification if they qualified, but they must use different employees in each business. The adopted rulemaking allows employers to use the same employees in more than one basic risk classification as long as work records are kept and the rules allow. The rulemaking also removes the need to identify the governing class, and simplifies reporting by including all instructions for this situation in one rule.
