

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

Apprenticeship by the Numbers

There were **19,808** active apprentices for the 12-month time period from 01/01/2020 to 12/31/2020. **2,248** were female and **6,521** were minority. Over the last quarter (October-December 2020), there were **16,584** active apprentices. All data valid as of 01/20/2020.





APPRENTICE ACTIVITY (FROM 10/01/2020 – 12/31/2020):


- **16,584** Active apprentices during the time period

Lt. Governor announces new CWU program counting experience toward bachelor's degree

The first program in the nation that will recognize work and apprenticeship experience to earn a bachelor's degree is launching through a partnership between Central Washington University and Renton Technical College, according to the lieutenant governor's office.

The program will offer adults working in the building and construction trades an opportunity to earn a bachelor of applied science degree focusing on project management, according to a news release.

Certain work and apprenticeship experience will be counted for college credit, and coursework offered online at an affordable rate and flexible schedule will be provided through CWU, the program website said. Industry leaders are involved in developing curriculum and prior learning policies to ensure the program provides relevant experience.

The new effort is expected to help experienced professionals earn a degree without leaving the field or starting from scratch on a degree program. The intent is to bolster career advancement.

Rolling admissions for the 2021 winter quarter are now open through CWU's website at www.cwu.edu/it-management/bas-project-management.

The degree program, referred to as the apprenticeship pathway, is part of outgoing Lt. Gov. Cyrus Habib's [Complete Washington](#) initiative, which began in 2018 in an effort to increase the number of adults in Washington with college degrees. It will be taken over by incoming Lt. Gov. Denny Heck after the January transition.

New Pharmacy Technician Occupation starts its first Apprentice Cohort - January 2021

On January 6, 2021, the Health Care Apprenticeship Consortium's first Pharmacy Technician registered apprenticeship cohort started its classroom and lab, Related Supplemental Instruction (RSI), work. With Covid 19 protocols in place, much of the cohort's classroom and lab work will be conducted on line, including both classroom and remote lab work, and in person labs.

APPRENTICESHIP QUARTERLY REPORT

The Consortium's Pharmacy Technician Apprenticeship Training Program obtained Pharmacy Quality Assurance Commission and Washington State Apprenticeship and Training Council approvals in July 2020. The apprentices for this first cohort are working for the community-based Othello Station Pharmacy in Seattle.

The Pharmacy Technician Apprentices will graduate as certified Pharmacy Technicians licensed in the state of Washington, earn college credit, and earn a completion certificate from the Washington State Apprenticeship and Training Council. The Pharmacy Technician Training Program consists of 2000 hours of on the job learning and 264 hours of classroom and lab RSI learning. The program goes beyond training for the Pharm Tech certificate to include leadership and pharmacy operations skills. For this program, the Health Care Apprenticeship Consortium is partnering with North Seattle College co, and has received Career Connect Washington support, for this program.

The Health Care Apprenticeship Consortium is a multi-union and multi-employer Washington State-registered Joint Apprenticeship Training Committee open to all healthcare employers in Washington. The Health Care Apprenticeship Consortium is staffed and sponsored by the SEIU Healthcare 1199NW Multi-Employer Training and Education Fund.
