# Proposed Process Safety Management Requirements for Petroleum Refineries



Catastrophic events related to highly hazardous chemicals at petroleum refineries across the U.S. have tragically claimed the lives of many workers, including 13 in Washington State since 1998. Six workers died at the former Equilon refinery in Anacortes in 1998, and seven workers died at the former Tesoro Refinery in Anacortes in 2010. These tragedies led to significant discussion about what could be done to prevent them.

The Washington State Department of Labor & Industries (L&I) proposed updates to process safety management (PSM) requirements for petroleum refineries to reduce the risk of tragedy occurring again.

# Proposed new refinery PSM requirements include:

- Conduct Damage Mechanism Reviews for processes that result in equipment or material degradation. Corrosion and mechanical wear are common technical causes of serious process failures.
- Conduct a Hierarchy of Hazard Controls
   Analysis to identify and choose the most effective hazard prevention and control measures.
- Implement a Human Factors Program, analyzing things like staffing levels, task complexity, training, fatigue and other effects of shift work.
- Develop Management of Organizational Change procedures to ensure that plant safety remains consistent during personnel changes.
- Utilize Root Cause Analysis when investigating any incident that results in, or could have reasonably resulted in, a process safety incident.

- Perform and document a Process Hazard Analysis of the effectiveness of safeguards that apply to particular processes and identify, evaluate, and control hazards associated with each process.
- Provide for employee collaboration throughout all PSM elements, maintain stop work authority, and implement an anonymous hazard report process.
- Implement an effective Process Safety Culture Assessment program to understand the values and behaviors that can prioritize process safety over production.
