Dear Survey Participant,

The Department of Labor & Industries (L&I) is conducting a wage and hour survey to set prevailing wage rates for trades involved in **residential construction** for public projects. Your participation is important in establishing prevailing wages that accurately reflect current wages for **residential construction** in your area. If your company only works on commercial or industrial construction and does not perform work on residential projects, then this survey is probably not relevant to you.

The survey covers all work performed on public or private **residential construction** projects between July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018. You are receiving this letter because you represented these workers or your company's license status during the survey period allowed you to perform this work. You may submit an electronic survey online or print a survey and mail it to us. Visit the following web page to find instructions and a link to start.

We are asking for all hourly wages, hourly benefits, and hours worked on public and private **residential construction** projects. We need this information to be reported separately for each type of work. For example, we are asking for the work of **residential** carpenters and residential plumbers to be submitted separately.

The survey also asks for information to be separated by county worked and separated between work performed inside and outside the largest city in a particular county. We've included a list of the "largest cities" in each county at the survey web page listed above. At the survey web page, you will also find a definition of "**Residential Construction**" and a definition of each **residential** occupation being surveyed. The due date for data submission is January 3, 2020.

Please note that participation in the survey is voluntary. Information provided may be made available for public review if requested.
