

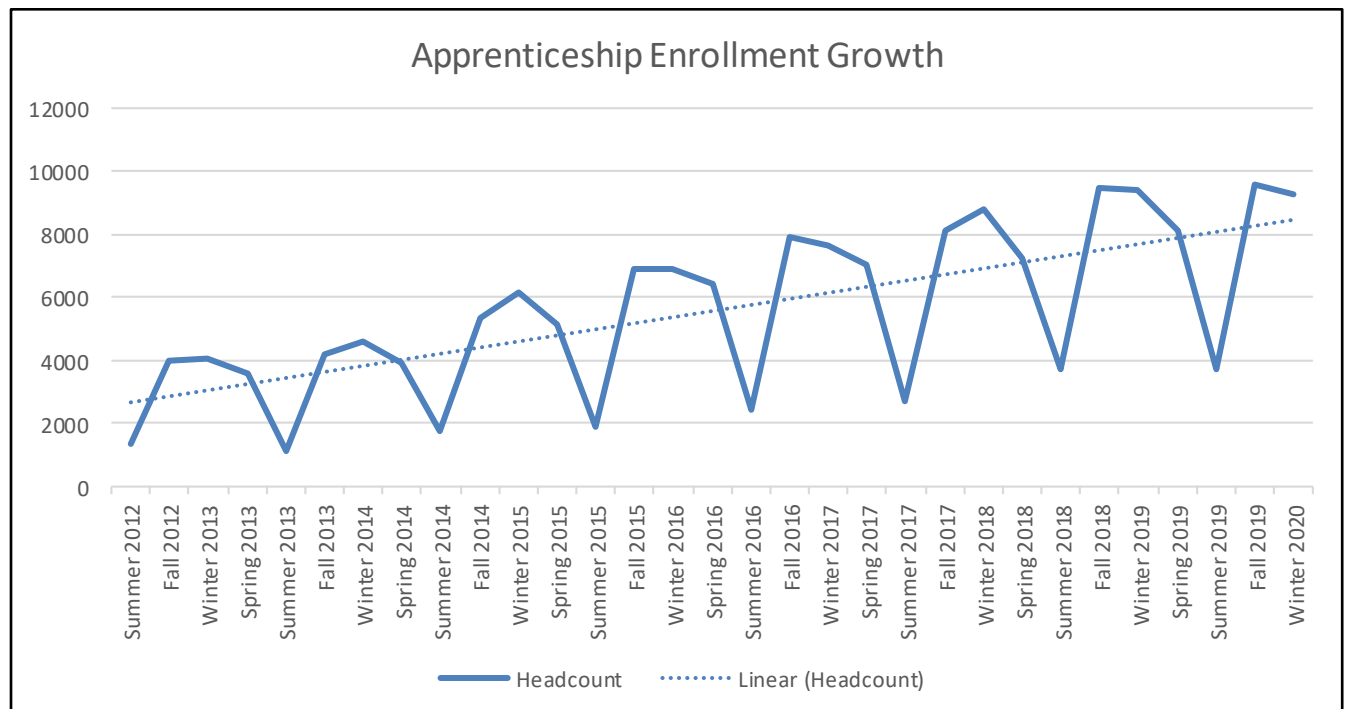
Report to the Washington State Apprenticeship & Training Council

Apprenticeship Enrollments

There are currently 22 colleges with 179 active apprenticeship programs. The headcount for apprentices in the winter quarter of 2020 was 9,237 (winter of 2019 was 9,401); representing a slight decrease of 1.74% from 2019. In a comparison of the FTES for winter quarter 2020 to winter quarter 2019, the data shows a decrease of 3.16% in FTES. This marks the second quarter in twenty-six quarters that there has not been a growth in apprenticeship enrollments. Fall quarter showed an increase of 1.25% for enrollment headcount. Note: apprenticeship enrollment peaked at 8,481 in fall quarter 2007, fall quarter 2019 set a new record for quarterly enrollment at 9,579. Annual enrollment of apprentices in 2018-19 (14,638) was 10.4% higher than 2017-18 (13,255). Annual FTES increased by 15.5% for this same period.

Apprenticeship RSI

The State Board for Community and Technical Colleges (SBCTC) conducted a Related Supplemental Instruction (RSI) review, lead by the Trade Review Committee on June 25, 2020 (following the rules set forth in WAC 296-05-317). The RSI review included apprenticeship standards with RSI plans for 6 occupations.

The recommendation to the WSATC for these proposals is:

1. **Approval**, as submitted of the standard from Construction Industry Training Council of Washington for proposed new occupations:
 - a. Mechanical Insulator, 47-2132.00, 10,000 Hours
 - b. Scaffold Erector, 47-2031.02, 8,000 Hours
2. **Approval**, as submitted of the standard from Vasuda Cosmetology Apprentice Program for proposed new occupations:
 - a. Cosmetologist, 39-5012.00, 3,000 Hours
 - b. Hair Designer, 39-5012., 2,000 Hours
3. **Approval**, as submitted of the revised standard from Healthcare Apprenticeship Consortium for proposed additional occupation:
 - a. Pharmacy Technician, 29-2052.00, 2,000 Hours
4. **Approval**, with the submitted recommended changes of the standard from **Dimensional Communications** for proposed occupation:
 - a. Electronic Systems Technician (Registered on or after 8-1-2020), 49-2022.03, 8,000 Hours

For proposals receiving a recommendation of **Return to Sponsor**, specific recommendations have been made for the sponsor to work with their Labor & Industries Apprenticeship Consultant for revisions or clarification of their proposal. If appropriate revisions are received within the allocated response period, the recommendation may be adjusted to the level of

Approval. At the time of this report, no proposals need additional revision or are recommended as **Return to Sponsor.**

The Trade Review Committee also had the opportunity to conduct further review and discussion related to two RSI plans previously recommended to the Council.

The recommendation to the WSATC is for these proposals is:

1. **Approval**, as revised of the standard from Axiall Corporation, a Westlake Company for proposed new occupations:
 - a. Industrial Maintenance Electrician 47-2111.00 8,000 Hours
 - b. Industrial Maintenance Mechanic 49-9041.00 8,000 Hours

2. **No New Recommendation**, of the standard from Independent Technicians Automotive Committee (ITAC) for new occupations previously recommended for approval (RSI plans received were the same as the ones previously reviewed):
 - a. Master Service Technician, 49-3023.01, 8,000 Hours
 - b. General Service Technician, 49-3023.00, 2,000 Hours
