<p>Comments: Wenatchee Valley College, SkillSource, and business partners continued to discuss solutions to the impending challenge facing rural electrical businesses in accessing 01 general journey level electrician apprenticeship programs with the passage of Substitute Senate bill 5126 which was effective July 1, 2023. The team has met with Associated Builders &amp; Contractors (ABC) on the viability of their program being a solution for our area businesses wanting a non-union apprenticeship pathway.</p> <p>ABC 01 Electrical Apprenticeship Program standards were developed and approved by the State Department of L&amp;I. The Related Supplemental Instruction was reviewed by the appropriate state Community College Board representatives and approved. The last step is final approval by the Washington State Apprenticeship and Training Council (“WSATC”). ABC is currently addressing objections to the Program filed by CITC and various union training programs, which the ABC Program will be competing with when approved.</p>			

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Our working group met during the quarter to help with the Central WA Region build out of “Training Agents” – companies participating in the Apprenticeship Program. Conversations with WVC to host a location for the RSI educational Program in Central WA will continue.

<p>Comments: Cascade Veterinary Clinics (CVC) program standards for the LVT and VA occupations were approved at the October 21, 2022, WSATC meeting as new standards with provisional status and three apprentices have begun since January 9. The VBOG (Veterinary Board of Governor’s) voted on March 6, 2023, to finalize the language for the CR101 for the rulemaking process to make registered apprenticeship an explicit pathway in the RCW for a LVT to sit for the national exam (VTNE). The rulemaking was published for public comment and reviewed by the VBOG. On 6.12.23, the VBOG voted 5-3 to submit a CR 102 rulemaking packet with an anticipated hearing in September 2023 which continues to move the rulemaking forward. On December 4, the VBOG discussed the public comments which heavily favored Cascade Vet (600+ in support with 30 in opposition). The vote to approve the CR102 passed 5-3 at the March 4, 2024, meeting.</p> <p>The State and National Veterinary Associations brought a lawsuit naming the WSATC, VBOG, and Cascade Veterinary Clinics to stop the rulemaking process and the continuation of the program because they oppose registered apprenticeship as a pathway to sit for the Veterinary Technician National Exam (a requirement to practice as a Licensed Vet Tech in WA State). The VTNE does allow registered apprenticeship as a pathway. At the December 15, 2023, Superior Court hearing in Thurston County, the motions were dismissed. This means the rule making process will continue. The Associations have appealed the decision.</p>
