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### Section II. Minimum Qualifications:

Education: Must be a high school graduate or have a G.E.D. equivalent.

Physical: Must be able to perform the rigorous manual labor required by trade and have the ability to work safely at high elevations with or without reasonable accommodations.

Other:

- 3. All documentation for minimum qualifications must be provided at the time of application. This includes high school diploma, G.E.D. certificate or official transcripts from secondary or post secondary schooling, copy of driver's license, social security card or other proof of I-9 (employment) status.
- 4. Exceptions may be made by the JATC to the above qualifications if admission as an apprentice will benefit the applicant and the industry. The amount of credit given for previous work experience shall be determined by the JATC or their representative after a careful review of the merits of each case.

### 1. All Occupations:

- b. Information on apprenticeship openings, the application process, and applications will be available at the offices of the Western Washington Masonry Trades Apprenticeship Training Center located at 6737 Corson Avenue South, Building "D", Seattle, WA 98108, between 7:00 6:30 AM and 2:00 PM on Monday through Friday and at our levelupnw.org website. Applications will be accepted throughout the year as individuals express interest.
- c. All documentation for minimum qualifications must be provided at the time of application. This includes high school diploma, G.E.D. certificate or official transcripts from secondary or post-secondary schooling, copy of driver's license, social security card or other proof of I-9 (employment) status.

e. Exceptions may be made by the JATC to the above qualifications if admission as an apprentice will benefit the applicant and the industry. The amount of credit given for previous work experience shall be determined by the JATC or their representative (designee) after a careful review of the merits of each case.

- 2. <u>Bricklayer, Terrazzo Worker, Marble Setter, "Pointer/Cleaner/Caulker", Tile Terrazzo Marble Finisher, Brick and Block Finisher</u>
- a. As apprenticeships openings become available, applicants will be selected from the eligibility list, in descending order of ranking, they must pass a drug test, and will then complete an eight a six-week pre-apprenticeship job class.
- b. After the applicant's first week of pre-job class in the Bricklayers and Allied Craft workers Local #1 of WA/AK (BAC) crafts rotation and safety classes, the applicant's shall select their specific BAC craft to finish the remainder of their pre-job class.
- b. c. After successfully completing the eight-six week pre-apprenticeship job class, the applicant shall be offered an apprenticeship in order ranking. If the applicant accepts the apprenticeship, they shall be registered with the Department of Labor and Industries, Apprenticeship Section, as a starting apprentice.
- e.<u>d.</u> In the event that new apprentices are needed to supply industry demand, applicants may be selected in advance of completion of the <u>eight-six</u> week pre-apprenticeship <u>job</u> class. It is possible that applicants with prior industry experience may be selected ahead of those without such experience and in other than ranked order, due to the provision of safety training during the class and necessity to provide this training to those without prior experience in the construction industry or specifically the masonry trades.

### 3. <u>Brick and Block Finisher:</u>

- a. As apprenticeships openings become available, applicants will be selected from the eligibility list, in descending order of ranking, they must pass a drug test, and will then complete a two-week pre-apprenticeship class.
- b. After successfully completing the two-week pre-apprenticeship class, the applicant shall be offered an apprenticeship. If the applicant accepts the apprenticeship, they shall be registered with the Department of Labor and Industries, Apprenticeship Section, as a starting apprentice.
- e. In the event that new apprentices are needed to supply industry demand, applicants may be selected in advance of completion of the two-week pre-apprenticeship class. It is possible that applicants with prior industry experience may be selected ahead of those without such experience and in other than ranked order, due to the provision of safety training during the class and necessity to provide this training to those without prior experience in the construction industry or specifically the masonry trades.
- 4. Terrazzo Worker and Marble Setter and "Pointer, Cleaner, and Caulker":

As apprenticeship openings become available, applicants will be selected from the eligibility list in descending order of ranking, they much pass a drug test, and offered an apprenticeship. If the applicant accepts the apprenticeship, they shall be registered with the Department of Labor and Industries Apprenticeship Section as a starting apprentice

### 5. <u>Tile, Terrazzo and Marble Finisher</u>

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a. As apprenticeship openings become available, applicants will be selected from the eligibility list, in descending order of ranking, they must pass a drug test, and will then complete a four-week pre-apprenticeship class.

b. After successfully completing the four-week pre-apprenticeship class, the applicant shall be offered an apprenticeship. If the applicant accepts the apprenticeship, they shall be registered with the Department of Labor and Industries, Apprenticeship Section as a starting apprentice.

It is possible that applicants with prior industry experience may be selected ahead of those without such experience and in other than ranked order, due to the provision of safety training during the class and necessity to provide this training to those RECEIVED industry or specifically the masonry trades.

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#### 6.3. Tile Setter:

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a. Must have 1500 hours of previous experience applicable to the trades of verifiable experience in the tile setter, marble setter or terrazzo worker trades, verified by certifications, affidavits of work experience, or a combination of on-the-job training with credit given towards advanced standing as determined by the Apprenticeship Committee or designee. Applicants without 1500 hours of previous experience as defined in the preceding sentence or must begin as a "Tile, Terrazzo and Marble Finisher" apprentice and successfully accumulate 1500 hours of onthe-job training (OJT) hours or a combination of OJT and credit given for advanced standing and successfully complete scheduled related/supplemental instruction (RSI) classes.

#### 7. EXEMPTIONS:

Move elements 7a. and 7b. in their entirety to #8 so they become the new 8a. and new 8b.

### 8.4. EXCEPTIONS (Direct Entry):

- a.c. (Direct Entry): For Individuals individuals who become I.U. of B.A.C., Local 1 members as stated in section 7 4. a & b above. All all minimum requirements qualifications will be waived except the following:
  - (3) Must pass a drug test.

- b.d. (Direct Entry) Persons-Individuals completing a Job Corps program under the I.U. of B.A.C. may be granted direct entry. Applicant Must must meet all minimum requirements and pass a drug test.
- e.e. (Direct Entry) Those individuals Individuals who have completed a JATC approved pre-apprenticeship programs may be granted direct entry. Applicant Must must meet all minimum requirements and pass a drug test.

h. Individuals who have completed the Western Washington Masonry Trades Pre-Apprenticeship Program, minimum of four (4) weeks, 160 hours, may be granted direct entry provided:

(1) The applicant possesses the completion certificate for passing the Western Washington Masonry Trades Pre-Apprenticeship Program safety training class with a score of 80% or better RECEIVED

(2) The applicant meets all minimum qualifications

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(3) The applicant passes a drug test

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Section VII. Apprentice Wages and Wage Progression:

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The minimum ratio shall be one (1) apprentice to three (3) journey level workers for all crafts. Bricklayer; Pointer, Cleaner, and Caulker; and Marble Setter. The minimum ratio shall be one (1) apprentice to five (5) journey level workers for Tile Setter; Terrazzo Worker, Brick and Block Finisher; and Tile, Terrazzo, and Marble Finisher. In no case shall these ratios exceed one (1) apprentice to one (1) journey level worker employed on the job site and fabrication shop.
