Dear Mr. Martin,

We are pleased to submit this letter to request continued recognition of our Tri-Cities Apprentice Preparation Program operated by Tri-Tech Skills Center for the 8 school districts in the Tri-Cities (Kennewick, Richland, Pasco, Columbia Burbank, Finley, North Franklin, Kiona-Benton and Prosser). This program has been in operation since 2009 and continues to receive tremendous support from our local apprentice training coordinators and programs.

Since its inception, the intention of the program is providing opportunities for high school students to learn about potential careers in the construction and construction related industries. The program is different than most apprentice preparation programs in that we do not have a stand-alone class, rather we work with the programs at Tri-Tech Skills Center as well all the CTE programs at all the local high schools. Our program consists of events like Construction Career Day, Careers in Manufacturing and GRITT (MAGIC) Camp for girls on a large scale as well as monthly afternoon/evening classes held at the apprentice training centers with their instructors and apprentices. These classes are held after school hours for the students to show the initiative to attend and find out about career possibilities. These sessions are usually approximately 2 to 2.5 hours and include the electrical, sheet metal, iron worker, laborers, plumbers/steamfitters, and carpenters.

We have approximately 100-125 students enroll in the program every year (all the Tri Tech Construction and Welding students as well as others from surrounding schools) and will average 15-30 attendees at each session depending on the trade represented. Our Construction Career Day had over 700 attendees and GRITT(MAGIC) Camp had 25. This year we even had two field trips for our welders that included Local 598 and Local 14 at Apollo Construction and Lampson International. Our student demographics mirror our surrounding communities and are about 50% minority with about 5-7% females. Our regular Tri-Tech students are juniors and seniors in high school while the attendees at Construction Career Day range in age from 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade and the females in our GRITT(MAGIC) Camp are usually 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade.

We do not have direct entry agreements with our participating apprentice programs, but we do have preferred interview arrangements whereby our students will at least get an opportunity to compete for apprentice positions, with way less work history than other candidates might have. The students are given credit for their time in our programs. Some students will also go to work in an entry level construction type position that will give the work history they need to compete for the more selective programs.

Our Tri-Tech programs all have industry based advisory committees which help guide the curriculum and activities taught to our students. A large portion of our Construction Trades program is building multiple houses for Habitat for Humanity starting with the dirt, so the students get lots of real world experience as well

as the satisfaction of helping families in need. Last year our Construction (with some help from our Firefighting class) helped construction 9 houses. A record year for us. Our welding program continues to grow with the students earning AWS SENSE student certifications as well as internship opportunities at various local employers including Sandvik Special Metals.

We have many successful former participants that are either apprentices or journeymen across the many trades. Below are the examples from the Laborers and the Electricians.
