II. MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Age: **At least eighteen (18) years of age at the time of hire.**

Education: **Must be a High School graduate or equivalent, or a vocational school graduate. An associate degree will be accepted in lieu of a high school diploma or equivalency. Documented proof of graduation is required.**

ADDITIONAL: Candidates applying for electrical trades and/or hydroelectric maintenance machinist apprenticeship programs must ~~have successfully completed with a grade of 'C' (70%) or above, high school level algebra, geometry, or trigonometry. Documented proof is required~~ a minimum of 1 year of high school or 1 quarter of post high school algebra, geometry or trigonometry with a minimum grade of 70% (or "C Average") or successful completion of the Basic Electricity and Applied Mathematics (BEAM) class. Documented proof is required.
