- 4. <u>After completing the application and providing the required documentation to meet the</u> <u>minimum requirements, an applicant will be scheduled for an interview. Interviews will be</u> <u>held at a minimum once per quarter, and as otherwise determined by the Committee.</u>
- 5. <u>The Committee will determine the number of applicants to be hired prior to holding interviews.</u>
- 6. <u>Applicants will be placed in a ranked pool based on interview scores.</u>
