Apprenticeship Enrollments


There are currently 22 colleges with approximately 180 active apprenticeship programs. During the spring quarter, 2021, 19 colleges had apprentices enrolled in their active programs. The headcount for apprentices in the spring quarter of 2021 was 7,118 (spring 2020 was 5,362), representing an increase of 32.75% from 2020. A comparison of the Full Time Equivalent Student (FTES) enrollment for that same period shows an increase of 35.44%. This marks the first quarter that we have seen a growth in apprenticeship enrollments, after six quarters of decline, which followed twenty-six consecutive quarters of growth.

The annual numbers for Fiscal Year 21 (FY21) reflect a decrease of 16.66% in headcount and 14.32% in FTES from the FY20 school year.

To put the current numbers in perspective, FY21 Spring Quarter FTES nearly recovered to the pre-pandemic levels seen in Spring of FY19 – a promising turnaround. That said, FY21 enrollments and FTES still hovered close to annual totals last seen in FY17, disrupting the otherwise steady growth trend of recent years. As pandemic recovery continues, we anticipate apprenticeship enrollment to resume its previous trend in FY22.
