## **CONCISE EXPLANATORY STATEMENT**

# Chapter 296-304 WAC, Safety standards for ship repairing, shipbuilding and shipbreaking

Public Hearing: September 27, 2022 Adoption: November 22, 2022 Effective: December 26, 2022

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#### I. Purpose of Rulemaking

#### A. Background

The purpose of this rulemaking was to better align chapter 296-304 WAC, Safety standards for ship repairing, shipbuilding and shipbreaking, with the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) personal protective equipment requirements for eye and face protection for Shipyard Employment found at 29 CFR 1915, Subpart I.

OSHA updated personal protective equipment requirements for eye and face protection for Shipyard Employment found at 29 CFR 1915, Subpart I. This required L&I to update chapter 296-304 WAC, Safety standards for ship repairing, shipbuilding and shipbreaking, to be at least as effective as OSHA requirements, as statutorily required per chapter 49.17 RCW, the Washington Industrial Safety and Health Act.

Additionally, this rulemaking incorporated housekeeping and formatting changes.

## B. Summary of the rulemaking activities

DOSH formed a work group to review the standard. The work group included Jim Rone, Tracy West, John Stebbins, Teri Neely, Bill Sloniker, Chris Miller and Cathy Coates.

DOSH conducted three virtual stakeholder meetings. Prior to each meeting, DOSH informed the public of the upcoming meetings via GovDelivery. In addition, DOSH sent a direct email containing the information about each meeting to members of the Puget Sound Shipbuilders Association (PSSA). The department posted information related to each stakeholder meeting on L&Is Rulemaking Activity Public Participation Calendar.

DOSH conducted the first stakeholder meeting on May 11, 2022. Nineteen attended the meeting. Attendees did not express concerns related to the draft language. No comments or questions were received.

DOSH conducted the second virtual stakeholder meeting on June 22, 2022. Nine external stakeholders attended the virtual meeting. Attendees did not express concerns related to the draft language. No comments or questions were received.

DOSH conducted the third virtual stakeholder meeting on August 3, 2022. Attendees did not express concerns related to the draft language. No comments or questions were received.
