Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: Based on legislation passed in 2018 and 2020 this rulemaking proposes to amend WAC 296-14-300, Mental condition/mental disabilities. WAC 296-14-300 provides for coverage of mental conditions or mental disabilities that specify pain primarily as a psychiatric symptom or that are characterized by excessive or abnormal thoughts, feelings, behaviors or neurological symptoms are not clinically related to occupational exposure. PTSD qualifies as such a medical condition and is covered as an occupational disease for certain industries.

Under legislation passed in 2018 and 2019, certain firefighters and law enforcement officers were added to the presumption that posttraumatic stress disorder is an occupational disease as provided by RCW 51.08.142 and RCW 51.32.185.

For public safety telecommunicators, PTSD may be considered an occupational diseases as provided by RCW 51.08.142. This rulemaking adds those specified industries and presumption into department rules on industrial insurance coverage.
