This report details current and anticipated rulemaking activities for L&I. This agenda is for informational purposes and the noted dates of anticipated rulemaking actions are estimates. There may be additional rulemaking activities not anticipated at this time, such as to implement new state laws, meet federal requirements, or other circumstances.
