



# PREPROPOSAL STATEMENT OF INQUIRY

**CR-101 (June 2004)**  
(Implements RCW 34.05.310)  
Do **NOT** use for expedited rule making

**Agency:** Department of Labor and Industries

**Subject of possible rule making:** Amendments to Chapter 296-150I WAC, Manufactured Home Installer Training and Certification Program

**Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject:** Chapter 43.22A RCW, Mobile and Manufactured Home Installation

**Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish:** The Factory Assembled Structures (FAS) Program is considering amendments to chapter 296-150I WAC, Manufactured Home Installer Training and Certification Program as a result of House Bill (HB) 1329 (Chapter 10, Laws of 2017), which passed the legislature in 2017. The bill replaces the mandatory penalty of \$1,000 for each infraction of manufactured home installation requirements with discretionary authority to issue a monetary penalty of no more than \$250 for a first infraction and no more than \$1,000 for a second or subsequent infraction. Rulemaking is needed to establish a penalty schedule for infractions for manufactured home installations as required by the bill and to modify the existing rules to comply with the new statutory requirements.
