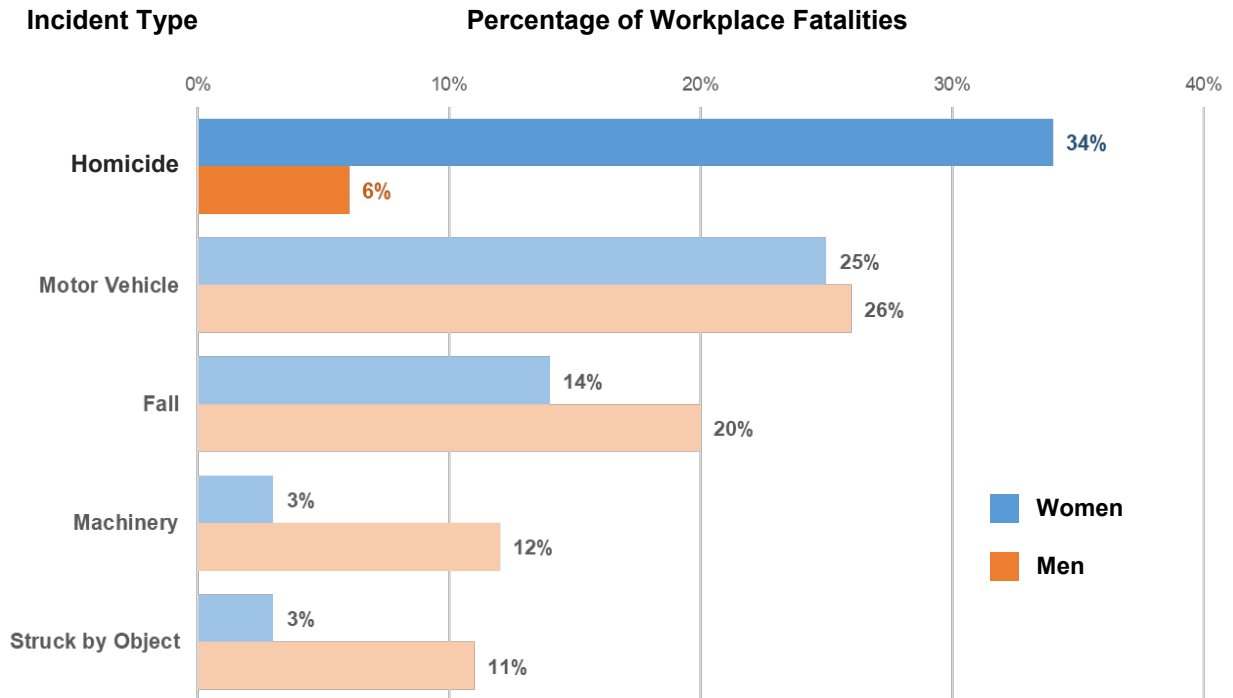


Gender Disparity in Workplace Homicide

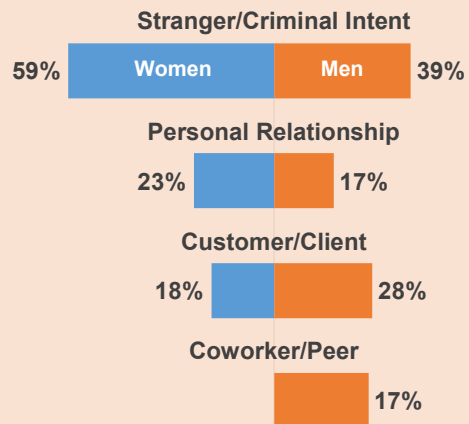
Washington Fatality Assessment and Control Evaluation program¹ (WA FACE), 2010-2019



More women die at work from homicide than from any other cause.

- From 2010–2019, 34% of women who died at work died by homicide. Among men, only 6% of workplace deaths were from homicide².
- Women who are killed at work tend to be victims of violence by strangers, usually with criminal intent, such as robbery.

Workplace Homicide Violence Type



1. WA FACE collects information on occupational fatalities in Washington State. It receives funding from the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), NIOSH grant# 5U60OH008487.

2. From 2010-2019 in Washington State, 22 women and 36 men died at work by homicide.
