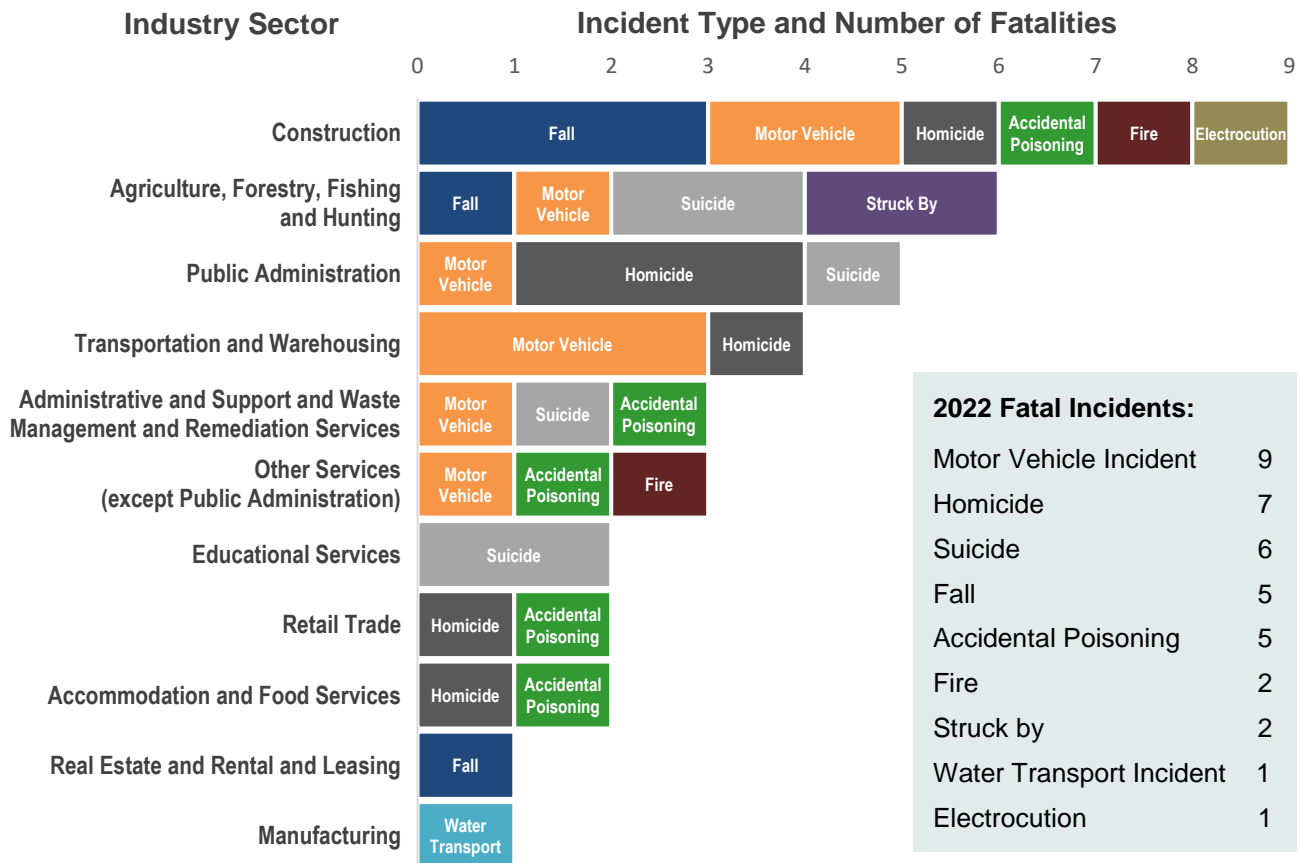


Washington State Work-Related Fatalities: January–June, 2022

Washington Fatality Assessment and Control Evaluation program (WA FACE)¹



- 38 workers died on the job in the first half of 2022.^{2,3}
- Motor vehicle incidents caused the most worker deaths, followed by homicides and suicides.
- There were more worker homicides and suicides in the first half of 2022 than in all of 2021.
- Nine construction workers died; the highest number among all industries.
- Three of the nine construction workers died due to falls.
