


2022 Work-Related Deaths

Washington State Work-Related Fatalities: January–June, 2022

Washington Fatality Assessment and Control Evaluation program (WA FACE)¹



- 38 workers died on the job in the first half of 2022.^{2,3}
- Motor vehicle incidents caused the most worker deaths, followed by homicides and suicides.
- There were more worker homicides and suicides in the first half of 2022 than in all of 2021.
- Nine construction workers died; the highest number among all industries.
- Three of the nine construction workers died due to falls.

1. WA FACE collects information on occupational fatalities in WA State. It receives funding from the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH).

2. Data are preliminary and are current as of August 22, 2022. Changes to fatality information may occur due to late reports or updates.

3. Numbers reflect date of fatal incident.
