


## Workers' Compensation Claims for Exposure to and Disease from COVID-19

WA State Fund and Self-Insured Claims Established between Feb 26, 2020 and March 31, 2023





17% decrease in workers compensation claims for COVID-19 from 2022-Q4 to 2023-Q1.



18% decrease in statewide COVID-19 cases among working age adults from 2022-Q4 to 2023-Q1.

Claims filed for COVID-19 were confirmed for known or suspected exposure to or disease from COVID-19 at work. Counts of quarantine, laboratory tests, hospitalization, and fatal are for all claims filed. Affected workers are under-represented in workers' compensation data, particularly outside of the healthcare sector. The methods and other key findings from this surveillance system can be found in the report COVID-19 Surveillance in Washington Workers' Compensation Data. Additionally, we have investigated the effects of long-COVID or post-COVID conditions on the return-to-work experience in the report Surveillance of Post-COVID Conditions using the Washington State Workers' Compensation System, 2020-2022. We estimate that 6-9% of workers' compensation claimants for acute COVID-19 will go on to develop post-COVID conditions, i.e. symptoms lasting for 28 days or more after the first positive test.

<sup>3.</sup> Number of positive tests are likely an undercount, as test results are not always known, particularly for self-insured claims. We linked L&I claim records with COVID-19 data from the WA Department of Health to identify 0.9% of the positive tests.
