

Problem with your construction project?

Try mediation to resolve it

Got issues? There are many ways to resolve disagreements between contractors and consumers. Have you thought of mediation as a way to settle your dispute?

What is mediation? Mediation is a process in which people with a dispute meet with an impartial and neutral third party, called a mediator, to resolve their conflict. The mediator guides the two sides through structured negotiations to help them reach a solution they both agree upon. Mediation is a type of dispute resolution that's an alternative to going to court.

Why mediation? Mediation is usually less expensive than court action and often brings a faster resolution. Fees vary for mediation services. Some organizations provide their services at cost or on a sliding fee scale. Others charge professional fees, depending on the type of mediation and the background of the mediator.

Know your mediator. Just as with any other service providers you hire, check them out first! Don't be afraid to ask important questions such as: How long have they been in business? How many and what types of cases have they mediated? Where did they get their training and education? Get informed!
